Using the new viewer Mirador in our website.






Since august the 2nd we use Mirador as our default reader and viewer.







In this document an overview and short explanation of the Viewer menu and the Object menu.

	<p>After the first step above, you can add an IIIF manifest url so a second (or several depending on how many resources you will add) can be shown in the same window / session)</p>

Workarounds IIIF viewer Introduction

Within the new viewer (landing page of all digitized works) <https://objects.library.uu.nl>

A number of aspects work differently than before.

For some functionalities these workarounds can be of use.

- 1 Is a functionality that was possible in the former Reader: Browsing using the arrow symbols on the keyboard. This is, by design not possible in the IIIF viewer.
- 2 A functionality that does not work within our website, namely the ability to export and import the workspace, without performing some extra actions yourself. Exporting a workspace is especially useful if you have a session with multiple resources in which you would like to continue working some other time.
- 3 A functionality to be able to share the current page (image url) in the Share menu.

1 Browsing through a digital book or atlas with a connected keyboard

The IIIF viewer Mirador works with its own arrows in its own viewer menu. It does not work with the arrows on a keyboard connected to your PC, laptop or tablet.

If you still want to click with the arrows on your keyboard, the following method comes close to that method. Move the mouse to the arrow with the browsing direction you want to browse through the book. Page forward or page backward direction arrow must be selected with the mouse first. After activation of the browse direction with the mouse, the enter button on the keyboard can take over. If you want to change the direction the mouse must make the first click but after that the enter button can continue and then it is 'browsing using the keyboard'.

2 Exporting and importing a session

Exporting and importing the workspace is useful if a session contains multiple resources that you want to work with at another time. Mirador itself cannot save that. Exporting works as follows:

- Click on the 3 horizon dots in the menu of the viewer ... Export workspace,
- Click on copy
- Open a source code editor, for example Notepad++ (free download and use, I will continue this instruction with Notepad++ as program)
- Paste the data into a new file and click on the Syntax menu
- Click on JSON under the letter J
- The data changes color due to changed code
- Save the file with a title for you easy to recognize

Importing works as follows:

- Navigate to the JSON file you saved and open it with Notepad++

- Select everything in the file and copy
- Open an object on <https://objects.library.uu.nl>
- Click on the 3 horizon dots in the viewer menu ... Import workspace
- Paste the copied text and click Import
- Click on the blue circle with the white + sign
- Click on the objects you want to see in your workspace in this 'Add Resource' window
- These will now appear in the viewer window and the number of active objects is indicated in the 'Go to window' icon, the icon below the blue circle with the white + sign.

3 Sharing a single page, or image url

The menu via the Share option at the top right of the menu works for the entire object. If you want to share one or more specific pages in the object you are viewing, follow the steps below:

- Make sure you see the page but also have a thumbnail view
- Select the page whose image url you want to share
- Right-click to open the context menu
- Choose the option 'Copy image link'
- The example used in this instruction: page 12 of *Responsio Urbani Rhegij ad duos libros primum & tertium de Missa Ioannis Eccij quibus, Missam esse Sacrificium ex scripturis ostendere, & aduersae partis obiecta diluere conatur*. - If you click on it, the page will open in thumbnail format
- If you change 120 to 1200 <https://objects.library.uu.nl/fcgi-bin/iipsrv.fcgi?IIIF=/manifestation/viewer/11/94/58/119458610795720279028190563940571687472.jp2/full/,1200/0/default.jpg> the page / image will open in normal reading format.
